#### **Regulatory System Capability**

For information

Since our last update, a special edition of the Ministry for Regulation newsletter was sent out on 17 March 2025, highlighting the work being done in Regulatory System Capability. The response to date has been positive:

- over 600 visits to the RegRoom and Communities of Practice webpage within 24 hours
- nearly 100 new logins to RegRoom in the same period, and
- growing interest from local government in our resources and learning opportunities.

This is a strong indication that engagement with the Ministry's regulatory capability work is increasing.

A more detailed update will be provided to you in the coming weeks once we have done some analysis on the broader trends and long-term engagement.

#### **Agricultural and Horticultural Products Regulatory Review**

For information

In our last update we confirmed that you agreed with the roles and responsibilities proposed for yourself and the Ministry for Regulation around the implementation of the Agricultural and Horticultural Products Regulatory Review (MFR2025-040).

Your intention was to be a joint minister for the May Cabinet paper (with the Ministry for Regulation leading this), with the Minister for Food Safety (Hon Andrew Hoggard) \$\frac{s}{(iv)}\$

. After May 2025, our role would reduce to monitoring and providing second opinion advice and feedback upon requests.

We understand that your office has sought confirmation that Ministers Hoggard and Simmonds are supportive of this approach. However, at the Senior Officials Advisory Group meeting on 13 March 2025, their respective officials noted that they had not yet been advised of this matter. We would appreciate your office following up with Ministers Hoggard and Simmonds.

We are continuing to work with the Ministry for Primary Industries and the Ministry for the Environment to provide joint ministers with an update on a high-level timeline and \$9(2)(f)(iv)

#### **Early Childhood Education Regulatory Review**

For information

The Cabinet Paper 1: Early Childhood Education Regulatory Sector Review recommendations and next steps has been lodged for the Cabinet Expenditure and Regulatory Review Committee meeting on 25 March 2025. The paper was lodged following minor feedback from the Prime Minister's office and other agencies and includes a Regulatory Impact Statement from the Ministry of Health for the removal of the Health (Immunisation) Regulations 1995.

We are working with the Ministry of Education and the Education Review Office on engagement material to support announcements post-Cabinet.

We continue to support Ministry of Education officials as they work through implementation planning for the recommendations.

#### **Hairdressing and Barbering Regulatory Review**

For information

Following our meeting with you on 17 March 2025 where we discussed the Hairdressing and Barbering Regulatory Review's (the Review) findings and options for reform, we are on track to provide you with the Review's Final Report on 27 March 2025. As per your direction at the 17 March meeting, the Final Report and associated cover briefing will have some consideration of issues raised by submitters about the requirements of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (SSAA).

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Our Cabinet paper timeline remains unchanged – with the intention for you to take policy decisions to the Cabinet Expenditure and Regulatory Review Committee on 6 May 2025, and Cabinet on 12 May 2025. You will receive a draft Cabinet paper for consultation on 10 April 2025.

Final consultation with stakeholders on options for reform is ongoing and being considered in our final analysis.

#### **Regulatory Response / Red Tape Portal**

For information

As at 19 March 2025, the Ministry has received 658 submissions on red tape issues, with 59 of these under active investigation, including 10 issues (one investigation) relating to anti-money laundering.

The investigations are looking at a wide range of issues raised by submitters, including health and safety regulations, issues impacting retail businesses, health/medical products, and government identification requirements including information-sharing between agencies.
