Purpose of briefing

- This briefing accompanies material you have requested from the Ministry for Regulation, to facilitate your discussions with Hon Nicola Willis, Hon Judith Collins KC, and Hon Shane Jones.
- 3. This material can also be used to inform wider discussion with other interested Ministers.

Background

- 4. Following the meeting of 7 April 2025 Cabinet deferred consideration of the submission Progressing a Regulatory Standards Bill: Policy Approvals [CAB-25-SUB-0110] until 28 April 2025 and invited you to work together with Hon Nicola Willis, Hon Judith Collins KC and Hon Shane Jones to return to Cabinet with additional advice (CAB-25-MIN-0110 refers).
- 5. To facilitate your discussions with your colleagues you have asked for:
 - a. a high-level depiction of how the new processes could fit within Regulatory Management System processes, alongside a description of how the consistency assessment process might look like for agencies
 - b. worked examples of consistency assessments.
- 6. **Annex 1** of this cover briefing includes:
 - a. a set of slides setting out an indicative process for consistency assessments
 - a draft framework setting out how the principles could be applied to proposed and existing legislation, and some considerations that would need to be made in doing so
 - c. worked examples showing how this framework could potentially apply to different types of legislation.

Approach to examples and indicative consistency assessment process

- 7. The legislation that has been assessed for consistency with the principles as part of the worked examples covers existing primary legislation introduced for the first time, amendments to secondary legislation and lastly a form of secondary legislation that does not require an Order in Council. The examples were chosen because:
 - a. they cover a variety of primary and secondary legislation
 - b. we could easily access readily available information to assess the examples as we are working under time constraints.
