# Regulatory Impact Analysis Non-Compliance

#### **Designing a rate capping system**

On 7 April 2025, Cabinet agreed a proposal from Hon Simon Watts, in his capacity as Minister for Local Government, to design a rate capping system for New Zealand (see EXP-25-MIN-0038). The paper sought agreement to the following principles to guide the design of the system:

- Independent Determined by an independent authority
- Transparent Simple for councils and their communities to understand
- Cost-reflective- Accurately reflect cost changes for councils
- Localised Considers differences between councils across the country.

Minister Watts plans to work with you, in your capacity as Minister for Regulation, and with other relevant Ministers (including the Minister of Finance and Minister for Infrastructure) to develop the system and will report back to Cabinet on the progress of policy design in December 2025. § 9(2)(f) s 9(2)(f)(iv)

No Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) was completed to accompany this Cabinet paper, and the proposal was not exempt (the proposal was denied an exemption in January 2025 and no further requests were made). The Ministry for Regulation is working with the Department of Internal Affairs to identify the next appropriate Cabinet decision point to prepare a supplementary analysis report.
