The Sector Leaders' Forum met for the second time on 10 July 2025. We attended the meeting as an observer. The key points covered in the meeting included:

The revocation of the Health (Hairdressers) Regulations 1980 was gazetted on 3 July 2025, with the revocation coming into force on 31 July 2025. The Ministry of Health is progressing the public health guidance for the industry through its internal sign-out processes, after our drafting of the guidance and leading it through consultation with industry stakeholders and infection control experts.
