Updates

Regulatory Standards Bill

For information

We provided an updated Cabinet paper and departmental report this week to support Ministerial consultation on the Regulatory Standards Bill. Alongside Finance and Expenditure Committee (FEC) appearances over the next few weeks, the team are also transitioning into implementation planning and guidance production. Immediate priorities include planning for the Board appointments and operations; commencing work on the necessary legislative exemptions that may be applied under Ministerial powers once the Bill is passed; and developing guidance to support agency and Ministerial consideration of the principles. Work is already underway on one set of guidance (associated with the fees and levies principle), and on how the consistency accountability statements will be implemented (e.g. templates, guidance on problem definition, and cost-benefit analysis with support from the Economics team).

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
